She was a gift for America's 100th birthday. The people of France gave her to us. Lady Liberty was made by Frederic Bartholdi.

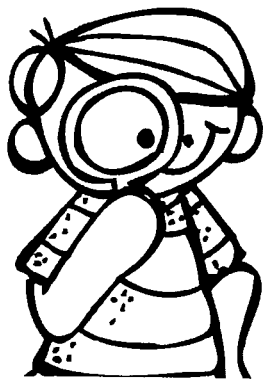
She is made of copper like a penny. Copper is brown when it is new.
